Readings:

Psalm 19: Verses 1 – 8 and Verse 14 (NIV)

The heavens declare the glory of God; the
skies proclaim the work of his hands.
Day after day they pour forth speech; night
after night they reveal knowledge.
They have no speech, they use no words
no sound is heard from them. Yet their
voice goes out into all the earth, their words
to the ends of the world.

In the heavens God has pitched a tent for

chamber, like a champion rejoicing to run

It rises at one end of the heavens and
