The supremacy of the Son of God

The Son is the image of the invisible God,
the firstborn over all creation. For in him all
things were created: things in heaven and
on earth, visible and invisible, whether
thrones or powers or rulers or authorities;
all things have been created through him
and for him. He is before all things, and in
him all things hold together. And he is the
head of the body, the church; he is the
beginning and the firstborn from among the
dead, so that in everything he might have
the supremacy. For God was pleased to
have all his fullness dwell in him, and
through him to reconcile to himself all
things, whether things on earth or things in
heaven, by making peace through his
blood, shed on the cross.

John 18: 36-37

Jesus said, 'My kingdom is not of this world.
If it were, my servants would fight to prevent
my arrest by the Jewish leaders. But now
my kingdom is from another place.'
'You are a king, then!' said Pilate.
Jesus answered, 'You say that I am a king.

In fact, the reason I was born and came into the world is to testify to the truth. Everyone on the side of truth listens to me.'

Rev 17:12-14

The ten horns you saw are ten kings who have not yet received a kingdom, but who for one hour will receive authority as kings along with the beast. They have one purpose and will give their power and authority to the beast. They will wage war against the Lamb, but the Lamb will triumph over them because he is Lord of lords and King of kings – and with him will be his called, chosen and faithful followers.'

Mark 4:35-41

Jesus calms the storm

That day when evening came, he said to his disciples, 'Let us go over to the other side.' Leaving the crowd behind, they took him along, just as he was, in the boat. There were also other boats with him. A furious squall came up, and the waves broke over the boat, so that it was nearly swamped. Jesus was in the stern, sleeping on a cushion. The disciples woke him and said to him, 'Teacher, don't you care if we drown?'

He got up, rebuked the wind and said to the waves, 'Quiet! Be still!' Then the wind died down and it was completely calm.

He said to his disciples, 'Why are you so afraid? Do you still have no faith?'

They were terrified and asked each other, 'Who is this? Even the wind and the waves obey him!'
