Facts about paper: The average person living in the UK uses around 200kg of paper every year. Paper and card make up 40% of the waste collected for recycling from UK households. For every tonne of recycled newspaper, we save 17 trees. Recycling paper saves almost 80% of the energy needed to make paper from new raw materials. It can take just seven days for old magazines and newspapers to be recycled into new ones.
