Readings:

Luke 4:14-19

Jesus Rejected at Nazareth

Jesus returned to Galilee in the power of
the Spirit, and news about him spread
through the whole countryside. He was
teaching in their synagogues, and everyone
praised him.

He went to Nazareth, where he had been
brought up, and on the Sabbath day he
went into the synagogue, as was his
custom. He stood up to read, and the scroll
of the prophet Isaiah was handed to him.
Unrolling it, he found the place where it is
written:

"The Spirit of the Lord is on me,
because he has anointed me
to proclaim good news to the poor.
He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the
prisoners
and recovery of sight for the blind,
to set the oppressed free,
to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor."

1 Peter 2:23-24

When they hurled their insults at him, he
did not retaliate; when he suffered, he made
no threats. Instead, he entrusted himself to
him who judges justly. "He himself bore our
sins" in his body on the cross, so that we
might die to sins and live for righteousness;
"by his wounds you have been healed."

James 5:13-16

The Prayer of Faith

Is anyone among you in trouble? Let them
pray. Is anyone happy? Let them sing
songs of praise. Is anyone among you
sick? Let them call the elders of the church

to pray over them and anoint them with oil in the name of the Lord. And the prayer offered in faith will make the sick person well; the Lord will raise them up. If they have sinned, they will be forgiven. Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective.
