We are continuing our tour of St. Johns after looking at our brasses we are now looking at the gravestones set into the floor at St John's.

On the floor of the North Aisle, there is large black gravestone marking the place where Richard Pope is buried.

Richard died on November 16th 1651, so it's pretty amazing that we can still read the inscription, given the number of feet that have walked over this gravestone stone over the centuries. He left a widow and one daughter. The inscription reads:

"tho' dead yet he lives in ye good name he hath left behind, sending forth it sweet savour like a precious ointment...his spirit lives with God in sweetest rest".

Richard Pope is described as a yeoman which in English history which was the word used to describe someone in the class between the gentry and labourers. A yeoman was usually a landowner. There are other people with the name Pope buried in the churchyard, they lived at Philpott's Farm (the land between Pield Heath Road and Yiewsley), perhaps they were all part of the same family.







Reading for Sunday 18th February 2024 Theme: Take the High Road: Fruits Reading: Mark1:40-45

- 40 A man with leprosy came to him and begged him on his knees, "If you are willing, you can make me clean."
- 41 Filled with compassion, Jesus reached out his hand and touched the man. "I am willing," he said. "Be clean!"
- 42 Immediately the leprosy left him and he was cured. 43 Jesus sent him away at once with a strong warning:
- 44 "See that you don't tell this to anyone. But go, show yourself to the priest and offer the sacrifices that Moses commanded for your cleansing, as a testimony to them."
- 45 Instead he went out and began to talk freely, spreading the news. As a result, Jesus could no longer enter a town openly but stayed outside in lonely places. Yet the people still came to him from everywhere.

Readings for Sunday 25th February 2024 Theme: Take the High Road: Growing Up! Readings: Mark2: 1-12

- 2 A few days later, when Jesus again entered Capernaum, the people heard that he had come home.
- 2 So many gathered that there was no room left, not even outside the door, and he preached the word to them.
- 3 Some men came, bringing to him a paralytic, carried by four of them.
- 4 Since they could not get him to Jesus because of the crowd, they made an opening in the roof above Jesus and, after digging through it, lowered the mat the paralysed man was lying on.
- 5 When Jesus saw their faith, he said to the paralytic, "Son, your sins are forgiven." 6 Now some teachers of the law were sitting there, thinking to themselves,
- 7 "Why does this fellow talk like that? He's blaspheming! Who can forgive sins but God alone?"
- 8 Immediately Jesus knew in his spirit that this was what they were thinking in their hearts, and he said to them, "Why are you thinking these things?
- 9 Which is easier: to say to the paralytic, 'Your sins are forgiven,' or to say, 'Get up, take your mat and walk'?
- 10 But that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins...." He said to the paralytic,
- 11 "I tell you, get up, take your mat and go home."
- 12 He got up, took his mat and walked out in full view of them all. This amazed everyone and they praised God, saying, "We have never seen anything like this!"







EASTER PROJECT


It's time to get creative!



A cycle of growth, preparing in winter for the new growth of spring.




Volunteering at St. John's
